



The following exemplar is fully documented to show what is possible when purchasing the **System Version** of the **Training Resource Package “Developing Manual Handling Skills: Part 1 – Core Skills for the Workplace”**.

Tugalonga College – A Vocational Education Case

Background

Marilyn Rose is the Principal of Tugalonga College based on the Eyre Peninsula in South Australia. Her College was set up some ten years ago as a model school for the provision of year 11 and 12 education, with a strong focus on the **Vocational Education stream**.

While this college still runs high standard courses from which students are able to gain the necessary University entrance scores, many students are attracted to Tugalonga for the quality and practical Vocational Education that it offers.

The college has well developed vocational offerings in the hospitality, retail, community health and construction areas. Students are able to obtain **nationally recognised qualifications** that can then lead them on to Traineeships/Apprenticeships and further full time Technical and Further Educational Colleges (TAFE’s in Australia).

Marilyn is particularly proud of the communication she has set up with the local TAFE College. Her students are able to seamlessly move between the institutions with full credit transfer.

As part of this successful initiative Marilyn and her staff are constantly searching for curriculum materials that are up to date and employ the best of educational and teaching practice.

She is also aware that the increasing use of technology, producing media aware students, requires resource materials that will **capture the imagination and attention to learning** that she wishes to foster. The time to search and collate materials into resource packages for her teachers is unfortunately limited in the busy world of teaching and assessing. There just never is enough time!

Marilyn's Vocational Teachers have regular curriculum meetings and, over time, have discussed the competencies that they have to teach and assess in the Nationally Accredited Courses that they are delivering.

As a group they have approached Marilyn with a **core need** that they have all identified. Manual Handling competencies, framed in different ways in different courses, have to be covered adequately.

Staff have had varying approaches over the years but with **no real common approach** or materials bank being developed. This of course is a very serious topic as their students regularly are in workplaces as part of their courses and they need to have good basic knowledge and practical skills in this area.

Marilyn, of course agrees that a better set of teaching resources needs to be found and that a consistency in approach, and one which would satisfying further future courses her students may do, would be highly desirable. The option of hiring in a local Physiotherapist, as industry is sometimes seen to do, is way out of the tight budget scenario of educational institutions at around **\$AUD1800 per day**.

Initially Marilyn and her staff have great difficulty in locating **timely and relevant materials**. Despite a week of research her staff are only able to locate **basic PDF documents, some colourful cartoon type charts and a couple of outdated VHS tapes (at around \$AUD400 each for a 15 minute tape)**.

An internet search of the topic does finally uncover a new and complete Training Resource Package that contains all of the printed and visual materials her teachers will need to deliver core skills training.

Some staff will have to add some level of industry specific material, but the core program will be suitable for any of the Tugalonga VET Courses.

Another advantage is that this material would also be invaluable for students progressing further to TAFE or into the workforce. Their Participant's Handbooks provide permanent evidence of their achievement. Very useful for any **recognition of prior learning** process!

The Educational Model

Marilyn has now made a significant decision in the provision of teaching resources for her staff.

So for an initial outlay of **\$AUD445** Marilyn enabled one of her staff to introduce the materials with a small group and gain experience in delivering the materials. The “domino effect” then came into play.

Other teachers were then able to take up the materials (**extra handbooks for AUD \$15 net**) with confidence as their courses required. Each teacher was now able to deliver top quality training on Manual handling, with back up support and **transferability** to further educational endeavours. **The educational argument is compelling!**

In Summary

Providing your teachers with **high quality resource materials** makes for far more effective and practical training.

The educational argument of consistent delivery across various vocational education courses makes good sense.
